

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

Developmental Services serve as the Single Point of Entry into the system for:

Waiver Programs

Medicaid Home and Community-Based Waiver Programs allow people greater flexibility to choose where they want to live and to use services and supports that best suit their needs in the least restrictive environment.

- Children's Choice Waiver
- New Opportunities Waiver (NOW)
- Supports Waiver
- Referral for Residential Options Waiver (ICF/DD)

Individual Family Support (IFS)

IFS provides assistance to children not available from any other resource. These services include respite care, personal assistance services, specialized clothing, dental and medical services, equipment and supplies, communication services, crisis intervention, specialized utility costs, specialized nutrition and family education.

Supported Living

Supported Living is intended to assist a person in living independently by identifying needs through a person-centered planning process.

Early Steps

Early Steps is designed to assist families in meeting the developmentally delayed needs of children birth to age three.

Flexible Family Funds (FFF)

FFF offers monthly stipends to families of eligible children with severe or profound developmental disabilities from birth to age 18 to help families meet extraordinary cost.

Mobile Outreach

SCLHSA offers medication management, individual counseling and primary care services to remote areas of our seven parish catchment area.

Primary Care Services

SCLHSA offers integrated primary health care services to active clients in our system that have been stabilized on behavioral health medication. The integration of primary care and behavioral health care provides another step in the continuum to recovery and resiliency.

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

Substance Abuse Professional Services

SCLHSA'S certified SAP provides assessment and completion interviews for individuals in violation of the Department of Transportation (DOT) regulation 49 CFR Part 40.

Anger Management Program

SCLHSA provides assessment, education and treatment of anger management. The Education Program requires completion of 2 sessions and the Treatment Program requires 15 group and 4 individual sessions. Fee schedules are available upon registration.

Family and Divorce Mediation

SCLHSA'S licensed staff will provide mediation services for domestic disputes or family issues: divorce property division, spousal support, custody, visitation, adoption, premarital preparation and more.

PREVENTION SERVICES

SCLHSA provides evidence-based prevention services in the school setting in Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. James, St. John the Baptist, St. Mary and Terrebonne Parishes.

Life Skills Training (LST)

Life Skills Training (LST) aims to prevent alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana use and violence by targeting the major social and psychological factors that promote the initiation of substance use and other risky behaviors. This program is offered in Grades 2-8.

Project Alert

Project ALERT is a school-based prevention program for middle school students that focuses on alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana use. It seeks to prevent adolescent nonusers from experimenting with these drugs, and to prevent youths who are already experimenting from becoming more regular users or abusers. This program is offered in Grades 7-8.

Kids Don't Gamble, Wanna Bet

Kids Don't Gamble, Wanna Bet is a school-based prevention program designed to discourage underage gambling through improved critical thinking and problem solving. This program is offered in Grades 3-8.

SYNAR

SYNAR is a program designed to educate and reduce retailer violations of the law which prohibits the sale and distribution of tobacco products to persons under 18.



Social Security Disability Evaluations

SCLHSA performs consultation and psychological assessment for the Social Security Disability Determination Office to assist in identifying disability eligibility. Fees associated with this service are paid for by the Social Security Disability Determination Office.
