

Black Americans have the highest rates of colon and rectal cancer in the U.S. They are 40% more likely to die from it.

COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING OPTIONS



At Home Tests

Cologuard® (Multi-target stool DNA test)
FIT/FOBT (Fecal Immunochemical Test or Fecal Occult Blood Test)
Good for adults at average risk, not high risk.
No prep required – just collect a stool sample at home.

Results may require a colonoscopy.



In-Office Colonoscopy

Done under sedation in your doctor's facility.

Doctor uses a scope to look at the interior of the colon.

Best for all adults – average and high risk.

Requires bowel prep with fasting and laxatives.

Finds and addresses issues during the colonoscopy.

Ask your provider which screening is right for you.
