Is Contrast-Enhanced Mammography (CEM) right for me?

CEM may be a good choice if

- You have dense breast tissue. Your mammogram report may say "heterogeneously dense" or "extremely dense."
- You have a higher chance of getting breast cancer. This could be because of family history or genes.
- You **cannot have an MRI**. This might be because of the cost, an allergy to MRI dye, or a health condition like having a pacemaker.
- You had breast cancer in the past.

What can I expect from the test?

- You don't need to do anything special to get ready.
- The test takes about 30 minutes.
- You will get contrast dye through an IV.
- Your breasts will be pressed, like in a regular mammogram.
- Most people can go back to normal activities right after.



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
