Ochsner Chemotherapy Care Companion Program

Your care team is excited to offer this innovative health monitoring program as part of your oncology treatment.

We are thankful for your participation as we aim to provide the best healthcare possible for our patients and empower you to participate in your care.

What is it?

Chemotherapy Care Companion is a program offered to Ochsner's oncology patients. The program monitors patients who are undergoing chemotherapy or immunotherapy and observes vital signs during therapy to determine issues related to or aggravated by receiving therapy.

Who qualifies?

Patients who are planning on starting or currently receiving an IV treatment plan and have a smart phone may qualify.

What is included?

Patients will pick up a free digital thermometer, digital scale and digital blood pressure monitor at their nearest OBar location (listed on back).

What is required?

Once enrolled and set up, you will be assigned tasks to complete including a daily questionnaire, daily weight entry, daily temperature entry and AM/PM blood pressure and heart rate reading.

Your vital signs are compared to preset data ranges. Alerts are provided to your care team if data is outside the acceptable limits of these ranges. This may be an early indicator of potential side effects that could require assistance.

- Once the enrollment order is signed by your provider, you will receive a MyOchsner message with a link to the program consent.
- Pick up your free iHealth devices from an O Bar location near you.
